The WTO and the WTO TBT Agreement

- The only international body dealing with global rules of trade between nations
- WTO has over 160 members
- Its main function is to ensure that trade flows as smoothly, predictably and freely as possible
- WTO agreements provide the legal ground-rules for international commerce
- They bind governments (member countries) to keep their trade policies within agreed limits
- Trade disagreements between members are channeled into WTO's dispute settlement

Where do we as Standards developers fit in?

It lays down disciplines in respect of central government, local government, nongovernmental and regional standardizing bodies developing voluntary standards



Where do standards developers fit / Code of good practice

- Standards are not to be prepared, adopted or applied with a view to, or with the effect of, creating unnecessary obstacles to trade
- Standardising bodies shall use international standards as a basis for standards being developed where applicable
- Play a full part in the work of international standardising bodies as far as possible
- Avoid duplication of, or overlap with relevant international standards
- Standards are to be based on performance rather than prescriptive product characteristics
- Transparency through notifications of work programme
- Allow a 60 (or more) day comment period on draft standards



The SA TBT Enquiry Point as Notification Authority

- Monitors the SA gazette for technical regulations and notifies the WTO of potential TBTs
- Makes WTO TBT notification details and full-texts available via the Enquiry Point
- Assimilates comments, correspondence from SA stakeholders and WTO Members for submission to the dti
- Distributes comments, responds to correspondence from WTO Members and keeps
 Members and trade organisations informed
- Provides information & guidance to SA. industry and WTO Members on comment submissions



Support and Information for SA Stakeholders

- Enquiry Point distributes on a weekly basis all notifications submitted to the WTO and provides guidance for SA commenters
- Stakeholders submit regulations, comments, procedural questions, other information requests to the Enquiry Point and the Enquiry Point distributes comments/messages to the appropriate WTO member national enquiry point or government trade/export organization
- WTO members submit comments on SA notifications to SA Enquiry Point and Enquiry Point distributes comments to regulators and industry

- Allows for interagency coordination, awareness of unintended consequences of regulation /possible defensive concerns
- Gain understanding of TBT agreement and its obligations
- Connect to trade organisations,
- Maintain Repository of Comments

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
